The Seabrook McKenzie Trust is truly fortunate with having wonderful donor organisations willing to contribute to the Trust's Mission and Vision:

Our Mission: To support the education, employment, social development, legal rights and quality of life of people with Specific Learning Disabilities.

Many of you renew your donations year after year which is great for continuity. Therefore, the Trust is in a healthy position to continue offering financial assistance to the families who request it. With your generosity, although we work hard, we do not struggle to meet the needs of our community. We are delighted to be able to offer heavily subsidised fees to families, Community Service Card holders and beneficiaries – and offer further assistance to those who apply for it.

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Our services continue to be in great demand – the waiting list for assessments is 3-5 months. We have very positive feedback from clients about our assessment team.

We have specific arrangements with Ara and Advance Ashburton to provide assessments for their populations. We are grateful to the organisations that subsidise assessments for other specific geographical areas or specific needs.

The Small Group Teaching and Three Week Intensive have waiting lists. We have appointed a new Paediatric Occupational Therapist, Philippa, who has a variety of skills helping students with specific needs. She starts in April. We have an Arts Therapist (Kate) and Speech and Language Therapist (Bernice) on site. Both of these services are expanding.
